

# CLIL aims: tips

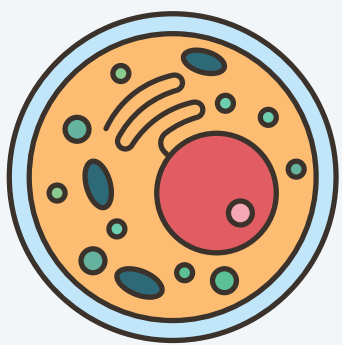
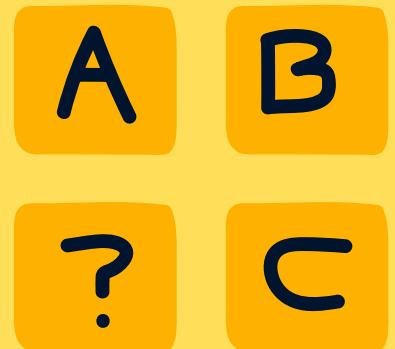


## 1. Can do

Write your aims as 'can do' statements: **Students can...**  
The more specific, the better.

## 2. Language aims

Language aims can be at word, sentence or text level.



## 3. Content aims

Content aims relate to subject topics, e.g. a cell, basketball, democracy, electricity.

## 4. The why (functions)

You can consider the **functions** of the language that the students are learning - the **why** or the purpose...



## 5. Relate to language skills



...OR formulate aims related to a language skill: **listening, watching, reading, speaking, writing.**
